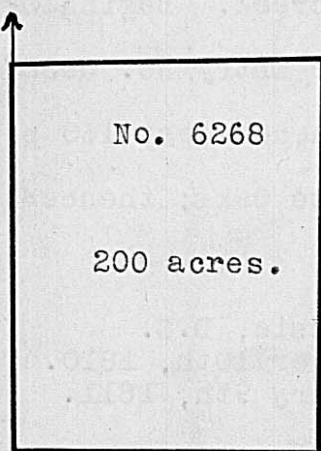


Surveyed for William Robinson, assee. 600 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, 200 acres on No. 5494 and 400 acres on No. 6129, on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at four White Oaks; three from one root, Southwest corner to Joseph Harness's Survey No. 5532, in the North line of Moore and Creighton's Survey No. 5476 & 5672; thence with Harness' line, North 191 poles to three Elms and a Black Walnut, Northwest corner to said Harness' Survey and in the line of Elihu Scott's Survey No. 6268; thence with Scotts line West 50 poles to a Stake in a prairie, Southwest corner to said Scott; thence with another of his lines North 444 poles passing his Northwest corner at 200 poles to three Bur Oaks, Southeast corner to said Robinson's Survey No. 6051; thence with his line West 270 poles to two Bur Oaks, one forked, corner to said Harness Survey No. 5533, 5797, 5798 & 8212 in the line of John Shearer's Survey No. 5552 and 5676; thence with the line of said Harness' Survey, S. 23 E. 34 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 57 E. 134 poles to two White Oaks; thence South 63 poles to three Black Oaks, Southeasterly corner to said Harness's Survey; thence S. 27 E. 186 poles to a Hickory, down and Bur Oak; thence West 36 poles to three Hickories, Northeast corner to said Creighton's Survey No. 7260; thence with his line South 186 poles passing his corner to a Stake in a prairie; thence West 120 poles to three Bur Oaks growing close together; thence South 107 poles to a Stake; thence East 270 poles passing the Northeast corner of Moore and Creighton's Survey to the beginning.

Surveyed for Elihu Scott, assee. 200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5494 on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at five White Oaks and a Hickory, one of the White Oaks marked E.S. about 140 poles South from the Southeast corner of William



Robinson's Entry No. 6051, running East 160 poles to two White Oaks and a Hickory; thence South 200 poles to two Elms; thence West 160 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence North 200 poles to the beginning.
