



N. 58 W. 11 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 77 W. 32 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 66 W. 10 poles to a Post Oak; thence N. 60 W. 20 poles to three Post Oaks; thence N. 38 W. 51 poles to a Burr Oak; thence S. 75 W. 12 poles to a Post Oak and Hickory; thence N. 83 W. 28 poles to a Bur Oak and Post Oak; thence S. 62 W. 54 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 70 W. 29 poles to two Post Oaks; thence N. 20 W. 148 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 75 E. 76 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 52 E. 54 poles to a Stake; thence N. 75 E. 94 poles to two Post Oaks in the line of said Baylor's Survey; thence with his line S. 20 E. 200 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Thomas Worthington, assee. 570 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4859 on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at a Black Oak and forked White Oak, corner to David Bradford's Survey No. 3972, running N. 13 E. 351 poles crossing a branch at 300 poles, to four Burr Oaks; thence S. 87 W. 387 poles to a Hickory and two "hite Oaks or Burr Oaks; thence S. 3 E. 241 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak; thence N. 87 E. 160 poles to two Hickories; thence S. 55 E. 156 poles to the beginning.
