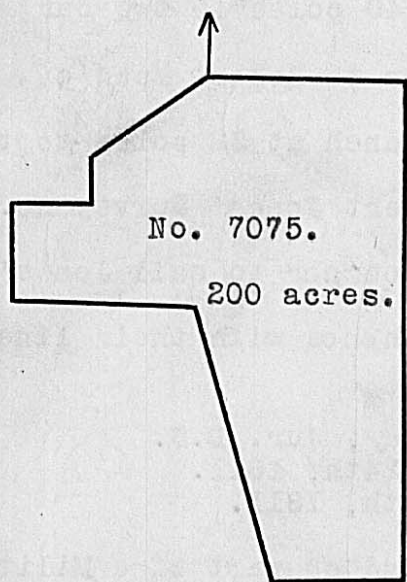


Surveyed for John Crawford 800 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 308 on the waters of Scioto and Darby's Creek. Beginning at two Hickories <sup>Southerly</sup> ~~Northerly~~ corner to Galligo and Thorice's Survey No. 5167, easterly corner to Torrence Doran's Survey No. 5143, and Southerly corner to Richard J. Water's Survey No. 7073, running with Water's line, N. 61 E. 417 poles to a Stake, corner to said Water's Survey and in the line of Thomas M. Bayly's Survey No. 6596; thence with Bayly's line and course thereof S. 10 E. 244 poles crossing a branch at 170 poles to two Ashes, and a Hickory, Southwest corner to William Barlow's Survey No. 6420, and in the line of the Representatives of Anthony T. Dixon's Survey No. 6554; thence with Dixon's line S. 80 W. 88 poles to two bushes and a Sugar tree, Northwest corner to said Survey; thence with another line of said Dixon's Survey S. 10 E. 167 poles to an Elm and Hickory in said line; thence S. 53 W. 296 poles to a Hickory and Sugartree, Easterly corner to George McCradie's Survey No. 3876; thence with his line and course thereof, N. 37 W. 180 poles to a Sugartree Ash and Mulberry in the line of Augustine I. Smith's Survey No. 3245, and Southerly corner to said Galligo and Therice's Survey; thence with their line N. 53 E. 160 poles to three ashes and a Lynn, Easterly corner to their Survey; thence with another of their lines, N. 37 W. 200 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Crawford 200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 308, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two Elms one of them forked, and a Bur Oak 164 poles S. 7 E. from the Southwest corner of the Representatives of James Winkfield's Survey No. 4573, running East 102 poles to two Elms; thence South 258 poles to a Bur Oak; thence West 68 poles to two bur oaks and a Hickory; thence N. 15 W. 148 poles to two Black Oaks and a Bur Oak; thence West 96 poles to an Ash, Elm and Bur Oak; thence North 52 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence East 40 poles to a Honey Locust, Elm and Hickory; thence North 22 poles to a Bur Oak and Honey Locust; thence N. 55 E. 72 poles to the beginning.
