



Surveyed for John Graham, assee. 105 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5791, on the waters of Treacles creek. Beginning at a Stake in a prairie, upper back corner to Caswell Gardiner's Survey No. 4938; thence with his back line S. 12 W. 111 poles to an Elm, Bur Oak and Hickory in said line; thence West 44 poles to a Black Oak and Small Hickory; thence N. 40 W. 56 poles to four Bur Oaks, three of them from one root; thence N. 29 E. 74 poles to two Bur Oaks, one of them forked; thence N. 17 W. 143 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence East 66 poles to a White Oak, Westerly corner to Joseph Swearingen's Survey No. 4820, 4945 and 5207; thence with his line S. 17 E. 143 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Dunlap, assee. 800 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 5943 and part of No. 5942 on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at two Bur Oaks, West corner to the Representatives of William Russell's Survey No. 6068; thence with their line N. 45 E. 66 poles crossing a branch at 7 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 45 W. 178 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence N. 63 W. 58 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence West 28 poles to a Stake in a prairie in the line of said Russell's Survey No. 6110; thence with said line South 213 poles crossing the branch at 70 poles, passing the Southeasterly corner of said Survey at 111 poles to two Bur Oaks, corner to John A. Fulton's Survey No. 7948 and 7997; thence with his line, S. 45 E. 390 poles to a Stake in a prairie, corner to Fulton's said Survey; thence East 213 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 12 E. 97 poles to four Bur Oaks; thence N. 22 W. 238 poles to a Bur Oak, Easterly corner to said Russell's Survey No. 6068; thence with their line, S. 45 W. 168 poles, crossing the branch to a Bur Oak, Southerly corner to said Survey; thence with another of his lines N. 45 W. 200 poles to the beginning.
