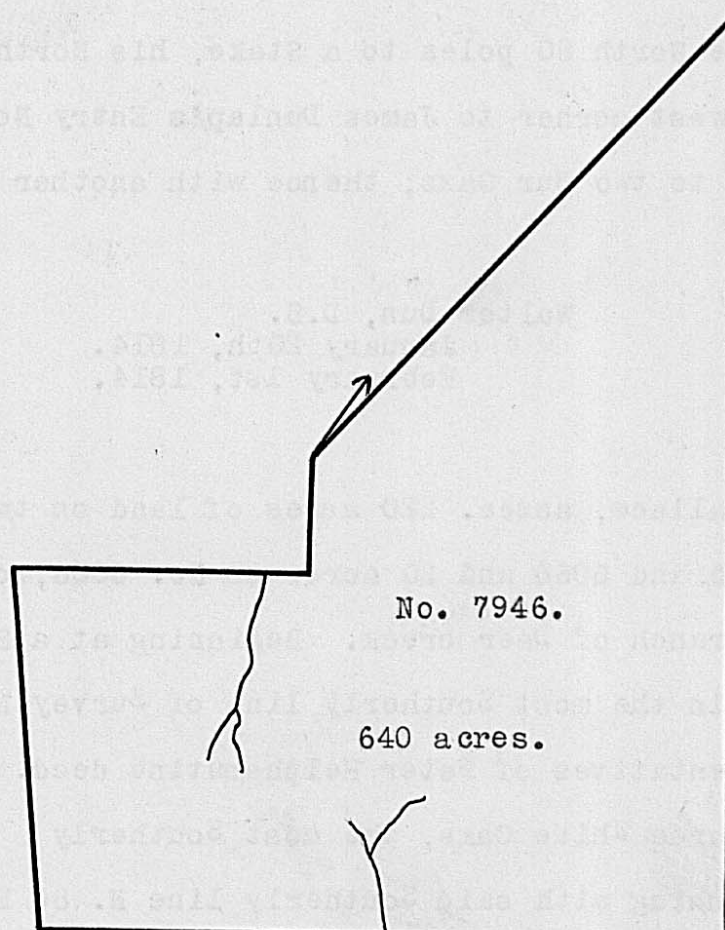


Surveyed for Levi Springer  
1000 acres of land on part of  
a Military Warrant No. 6045, o  
on the waters of Deer creek.  
Beginning at two Post Oaks and a  
Hickory, Southwest corner to  
Benjamin Stubblefield's Survey No.  
5205; thence with his line East 250  
poles to a Stake in a prairie in said  
line; thence S. 17 W. 448 poles to a  
Stake in a prairie, in the line of  
Jesse McKay's Survey No. 5891; thence  
S. 73 W. 45 poles to a Black Oak and Post  
Oak, Northwesternly corner to McKay's said

Survey; thence West 264 poles to two Post Oaks and a Hickory; thence N. 14 E.  $7\frac{1}{2}$  poles  
to three Post Oaks; thence N. 3 E. 84 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence N. 42 W. 104 poles  
to three White Oaks; thence N. 15 E. 96 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Hickory; thence  
N. 46 W. 124 poles to a Post Oak and Hickory; thence West 46 poles to a Red Oak, Hickory  
and White Oak, corner to the Representatives of William Sanford and William Robinson's  
Survey No. 6052 and 9803, in the line of Thomas Worthington's Survey No. 8922; thence  
with his line N. 75 E. 173 poles to a Bur Oak, Southeasterly corner to his Survey and  
Southwesterly corner to Cadwallader Wallace's Survey No. 5880; thence with his line,  
N.  $77\frac{1}{2}$  E. 204 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Levi Springer, assee. 640 acres of  
land on part of a Military Warrant No. 6045, on  
the waters of Treacle's creek. Beginning at three  
Hickories, Southerly corner to Richard C. Ander-  
son's Survey No. 4942; thence with his line and  
course thereof, N. 7 E. 325 poles to two White  
Oaks, Easterly corner to the said Survey, South-  
erly corner to Duncan McArthur's Survey No. 4769,  
and Westerly corner to John Ervin's Survey No.  
7676; thence with the line of Ervins said Survey,  
passing his Southerly corner at 54 poles, S. 35 E.  
481 poles to three White Oaks and a Small Hickory  
thence S. 55 W. 353 poles crossing a large wet  
prairie from 176 to 220 poles to three Bur Oaks  
one of them forked, a White Oak and Hickory in

the edge of a prairie; thence N. 40 W. 183 poles to three Bur Oaks in a small grove of  
timber in a large prairie; thence N. 55 E. 150 poles crossing a wet prairie to two Bur  
Oaks on the edge; thence N. 35 W. 57 poles to the beginning.
