

Beginning at three Hickories, Northwesterly corner to Tunstall Quarles' Survey No. 4086; thence with his line S. 20 W. 200 poles crossing Oak Run at 150 poles to a Bur Oak marked M; thence N. 70 W. 160 poles to Rock in a Prairie; thence N. 20 E. 200 poles crossing the run at 116 poles to two Bur Oaks and an Ash; thence S. 70 E. 160 poles to the

beginning.

Surveyed for Francis Ratliff, 160 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5038 on Oak Run a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at a White Oak and Black Oak about 180 poles Northwest of the Southwesterly corner of William Geddy's Survey No. 4510, on the Northwardly side of the old trace leading up Deer Creek

and towards the waters of Mad River; thence N. 70 W. 160 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory; thence N. 20 E. 160 poles crossing Oak Run at 82 poles to two White Oaks and Black Oak, the Black Oak marked I.M.; thence S. 70 E. 160 poles to a Black Oak; thence S. 20 W. 160 poles, crossing Oak Run at 122 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for the Representatives of Peter Helphinstine 1206-2/3 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5035 on the waters of Deer Creek. Begin ning at two large White Oaks, one of which is marked P.H., Northwest corner to said Helphinstine's former Survey No. 4387; thence N. 16½ W. 420 poles to five Hickories; thence North 30 poles to a Stake; thence N. 81 E. 470 poles to a small White Oak and small Hickory; thence South 500 poles to a White Oak and Hickory, in the line of said Helphinstine's former Survey;

thence with said line West 340 poles to the beginning.
