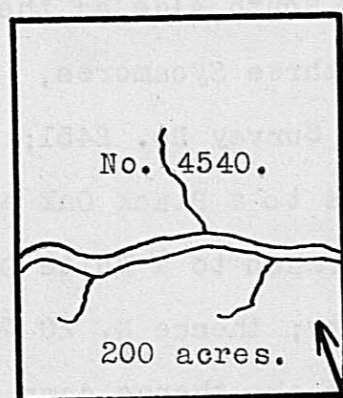


Surveyed for Elias Rector, assee. 146 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4971, on Walnut run a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at an Elm and Bur Oak in the line of the Representative of Peter Helphinstine's lower Survey No. 4387, 56 poles South of his Northeast corner, running thence South 198 poles, crossing Walnut Run at 144 poles to two Black Oaks, Southeasterly corner to said Helphinstine's Survey; thence E. 125 poles to a Stake; thence North 166 poles, crossing the run to a Stake; thence N. 40 W. 40 poles to a Bur Oak; thence West 100 poles to the beginning.

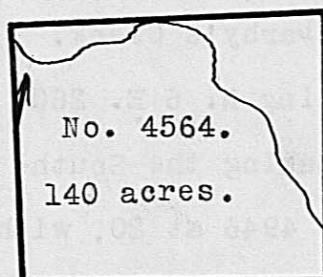

Surveyed for Charles Buck, assee, 200 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 1456 on Oak run a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at a Hickory and White Oak in the Westerly line of William Geddy's entry No. 4510; thence with said line N. 20 E. 200 poles crossing Oak run at 76 and passing the Northwesterly corner of said Geddy's entry at 160 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence N. 70 W. 160 poles to a Black Oak, Northeasterly corner to Francis Ratliff's entry No. 4511; thence with his line S. 20 W. 200 poles crossing the run at 122 and passing Ratliff's Southeasterly corner at 160 poles to a White Oak; thence S. 70 E. 160 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Thomas Worthington assee, 140 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4972 on a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at a White Oak marked 39 M. which is the thirty nine mile tree on the road surveyed by said Worthington from New Lancaster towards the mouth of Mad River, running N. 3 W. 70 poles crossing a branch at 40 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak; thence N. 87 E. 160 poles passing a bend of the branch to two Hickories; thence S. 3 E. 140 poles crossing the road at 70 and the branch at 100 poles to a Black Oak and Hickory; thence S. 87 W. 160 poles to a White Oak; thence N. 3 W. 70 poles to the beginning.
