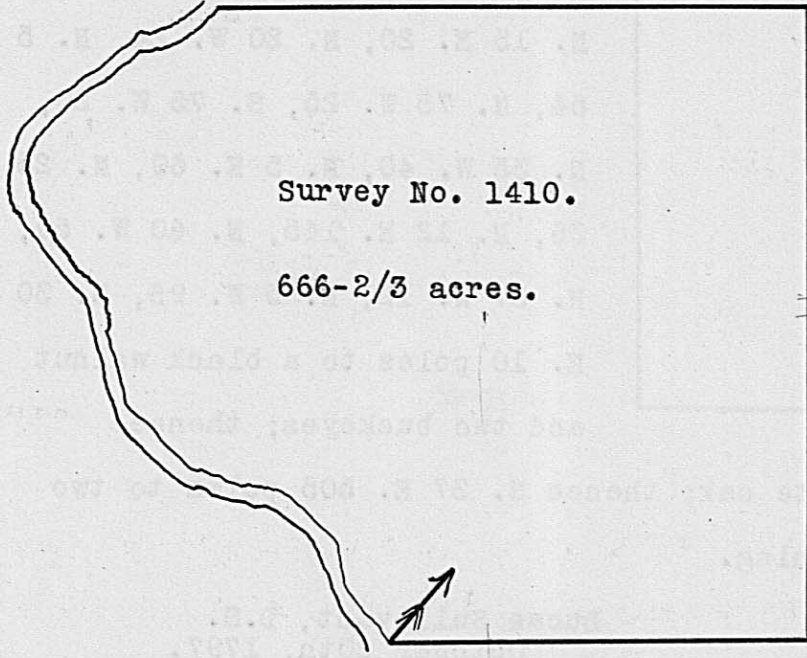


Survey

100 Acres

Surveyed for James Galt, heir at law and legal representative of Doctor Patrick Galt, dec'd, 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 194, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at two hickories and two black oaks, being the northeast corner of said entry for 2000 acres, this Survey being a part thereof running South 160 poles, crossing a new road opened by Thomas Worthington to a stake in a prairie or thin timbered land; thence West 100 poles to a stake in a prairie or thin timbered land; thence North 160 poles crossing the road to a stake in a prairie; thence East 100 poles to the beginning.

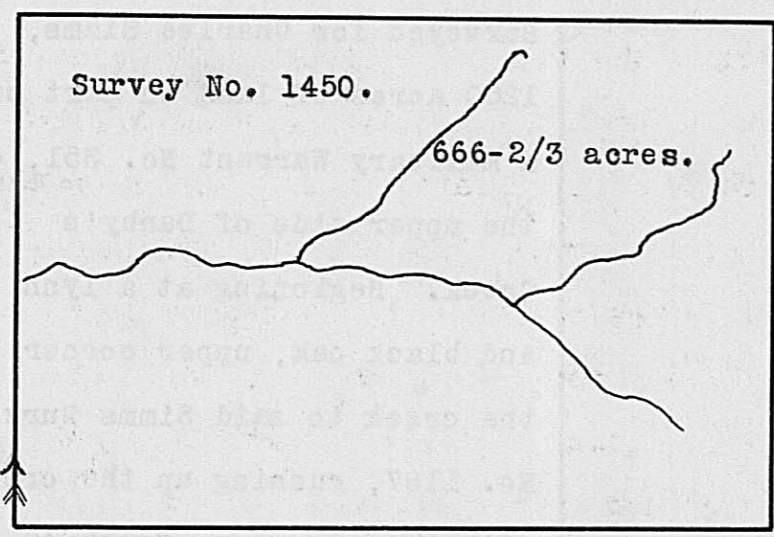


Surveyed for Clough Shelton 666-2/3 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 2446 on the upper side of Treacles Creek. Beginning at an elm on the bank of the creek in the upper line of Jacob Woolston's Survey No. 2836, running up the creek with the meanders thereof N. 81 W. 46, N. 50 W. 26, S. 88 W. 44, S. 60 W. 32, N. 82 W. 60, N. 52 W. 70, N. 72 W. 64, N. 7 W. 40, N. 11 E. 44, N. 86 E. 12, N. 30 E. 40, N. 12 E. 10 poles to a walnut and honey locust, lower

corner to John Gibson's Survey No. 2682; thence with said line, N. 53 E. 312 poles to two ashes and hickory; thence S. 37 E. 330 poles to two white oaks in said Woolston's line; thence with said line, S. 53 W. 214 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for William Tompkins heirs at law to Robert Tompkins, dec'd, 666-2/3 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 404 on the waters of Caesar's Creek. Beginning at an ash, a hickory and black walnut, four hundred and eighty poles North from the northwest corner of John Marshall's Survey No. 1432, running East 400 poles to an elm; thence North 267 poles to two elms and a black jack; thence

West 400 poles to a large elm, ash, mulberry and hickory; thence South 267 poles, crossing a branch at 127 poles to the beginning.
