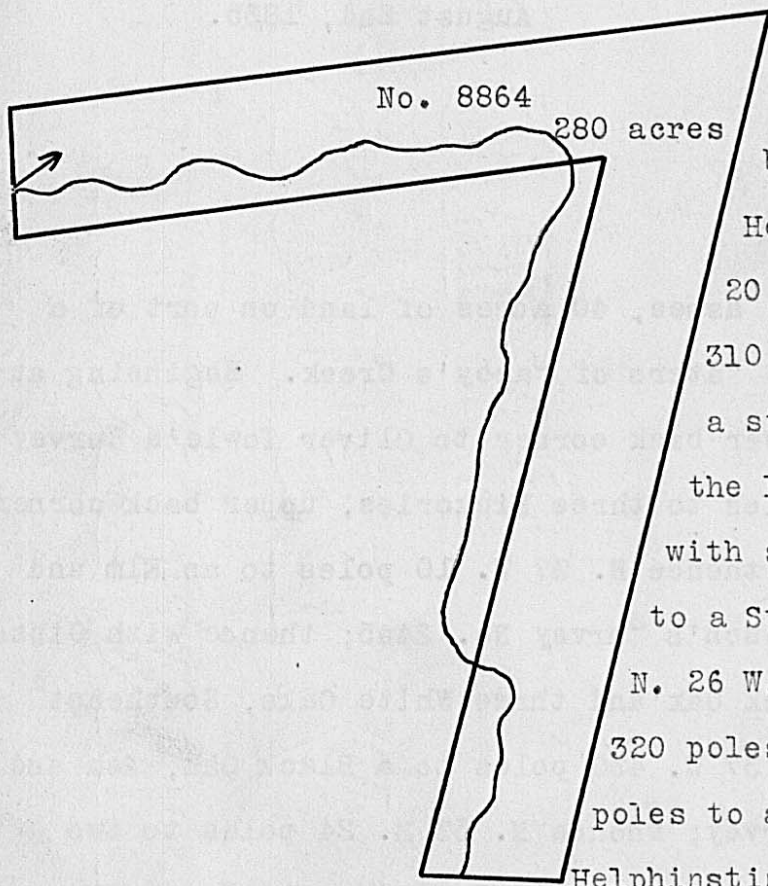


Surveyed for the Heirs of Joseph Harness, deceased, 157 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5187 on the same ground the same was originally Surveyed for Joseph Harness by Survey No. 5531, for 157 acres, bearing date 19th day of August 1814, on Oak run a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at a Stake on the South bank of the run, N. 20 E. from the most northerly corner of James Galt's Survey No. 4587, as that Survey was made on the 6th day of June 1810; thence S. 20 W. 20 poles to a Stake; thence N. 51 W. 80 poles to a Stake; thence S. 54 W. 77 poles to a Stake; thence N. 68 W. 58 poles to a Stake; thence N. 22 W. 92 poles to a Stake; thence N. 36 W. 143 poles to a Stake in the line of Robert Sharp's Survey No. 5897; thence with and binding on said line N. 46 E. 63 poles, crossing the run to a Stake in said line, West corner to William Creighton's Jurs. Survey No. 5670; thence S. 36 E. 160 poles to three Hickories and a White Oak; thence S. 22 E. 82 poles to two White Oaks and two Hickories; thence N. 54 E. 76 poles to a White Oak, Hickory and forked Elm; thence S. 51 E. 105 poles to five White Oaks, one of them forked; thence S. 20 W. 40 poles, crossing the run to the beginning.

Surveyed for the Heirs of Joseph Harness, deceased, 280 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5187 on the same ground the same was originally Surveyed for Joseph Harness by Survey No. 5531 for 280 acres, bearing date the 19th day of August 1814, on Oak run



a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at a Stake on the South bank of the run, in the East boundary line of the Representatives of Peter Helphinstine's Survey No. 4515; thence S. 40 E. 20 poles to a Stake in said line; thence N. 39 E. 310 poles to a Stake; thence S. 30 E. 232 poles to a stake; thence S. 26 E. 153 poles to a Stake in the line of Robert Sharp's Survey No. 5897; thence with said line N. 46 E. 65 poles, crossing the run to a Stake and two Hickories in said line; thence N. 26 W. 144 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 30 W. 320 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence S. 39 W. 396 poles to a White Oak and Hickory, corner to the said Helphinstine's said Survey; thence with the line of said Survey, S. 40 E. 40 poles, crossing the run to the beginning.
