

Being in V.M.S. 6297, being part of James J. and Paul E. Andrix's original 140 acre tract described in deed volume 150, page 445, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning for reference at a railroad spike set at the intersection of the centerline of State Route #665 (60') with the centerline of Lilly Chapel-Opossum Run Road (C.R.#72, 50'), said railroad spike being in the north line of said 140 acretract;

Thence South 15° 48' 14" East (assumed bearing) 797.73 feet, following the centerline of Lilly Chapel- $0\frac{1}{2}$ ossum Run Road and entering said 140 acre tract, to an iron pin set;

Thence South 28° 08' 29" East 260.70 feet, continuing along the centerline of Lilly Chapel-Opossum Run Road, to a railroad spike set;

Thence South 78° 17' 58" West 1742.79 feet, departing from the centerline of Lilly Chapel-Opossum Run Road and passing at 26.12 feet and at 1242.79 feet iron pins set, to an iron pin set in the east line of the Roman Catholic Bishop's 54.463 acre tract described in deed volume 268, page 776 and in the west line of said 140 acre tract;

Thence North 26° 56' 56" West 1827.09 feet, following the west line of said 140 acre tract and the east line of said 54.463 acre tract, to an iron pin set;

Thence North 25° 08' 35" East 363.03 feet, following the west line of said 140 acre tract and the east line of said 54.460 acre tract, passing at 79.10 feet a 3/4" iron pipe found with cap marked "BROWNING 7377" at the southeast corner of Forest Sr., Forest G. and Albert R. Stepp's 2.229 acre tract described in deed volume 292, page 230, also passing at 332.69 feet an iron pin set, to a railroad spike set in the centerline of State Route #665;

Thence South 72° 09' 29" East 55.09 feet, following the centerline of State Route #665 and the north line of said 140 acre tract, to a railroad spike set;

Thence South 73° 40' 12" East 1225.40 feet, continuing along the centerline of State Route #665 and the north line of said 140 acre tract, to a railroad spike set at the northwest corner of Paul E. and Gloria J. Andrix's 2.00 acre tract described in deed volume 166, page 430, said 2.00 acre tract formerly part of said 140 acre tract;

Thence South 16° 19' 48" West 288.71 feet, following the west line of said 2.00 acre tract, passing at 30.33 feet a "T" bar found with cap marked "PROPERTY LINE DO NOT DISTURB" to an iron pin set;

Thence north 88° 59' 01" East 398.16 feet, following the south line of said 2.00 acre tract, to an iron pin set;

Thence North 16° 19' 48" East 170.00 feet, passing at 140.17 feet a "T" bar found with cap marked "PROPERTY LINE DO NOT DISTURB," to a railroad spike set in the centerline of State Route #665;

Thence South 73° 40' 12" East 159.43 feet, following the centerline of State Route #665 and the north line of said 140 acre tract, to a railroad spike set;

Thence South 72° 23' 25"East 308.46 feet, following the centerline of State Route #665 and the north line of said 140 acre tract, to the place of beginning, containing 65.670 acres, more or less, and subject to all valid easements and restrictions of record.

Thence South 18° 00' 00" East 1499.46 feet, following the west line of said 50.042 acre tract and the east line of said 140 acre tract, passing at 36.21 feet an iron pin set, to an iron pin set in the north line of Donna J. Guyton's 39.560 acre tract described in deed volume 259, page 319;

Thence South 53° 46' 20" West 337.42 feet, following the north line of said 39.560 acre tract and the south line of said 140 acre tract, passing at 311.36 feet an iron pin set, to a 5/8" iron pin found in the centerline of Lilly Chapel-Opossum Run Road and at the northeast corner of Earl Dean and Patricia Ann Ingles 0.95 acre tract described in deed volume 213, page 120;

Thence South 53° 46' 20" West 1727.09 feet, continuing along the south line of said 140 acre tract, the north line of said 0.95 acre tract, the north line of James D. and Norma L.Brabb's 31.9447 acre tract described in deed volume 234, page 354, the north line of William R. and Rhonda H. Stump's 7.000 acres described in deed volume 267, page 594, passing at 26.06 feet an iron pin set, to a stone found at the southeast corner of the Roman Catholic Bishop's 134.9 acre tract described in deed volume 268, page 776;

Thence North 26° 45' 27" West 1254.00 feet, following the west line of said 140 acre tract and the east line of said 134.9 acre tract, to an iron pin set at the southeast corner of the Roman Catholic Bishop's 54.463 acre tract described in deed volume 268, page 776;

Thence North 26° 56' 56" West 389.20 feet, following the west line of said 140 acre tract and the east line of said 54.463 acre tract, to an iron pin set;

Thence North 15° 48' 14" West 220.81 feet, following the centerline of Lilly Chapel-Opossum Run Road, to a railroad spike set at the southwest corner of James J. and Mary E. Andrix's 2.00 acre tract described in deed volume 151, page 347, said 2.00 acre tract formerly part of said 140 acre tract;

Thence North 74° 11' 46" East 254.00 feet, following the south line of said 2.00 acre tract and passing at 25.55 feet a 5/8" iron pin found, to an iron pin set;

Thence North 15° 48' 14" West 342.59 feet, following the east line of said 2.00 acre tract, to an iron pin set;

Thence South 74° 11' 46" West 254.00 feet, following the north line of said 2.00 acre tract and passing at 228.77 feet a 1" iron pipe found, to a 5/8" iron pin found in the centerline of Lilly-Chapel-Opossum Run Road and at the northwest corner of said 2.00 acre tract;

Thence North 15° 48' 14" West 234.33 feet, following the centerline of Lilly Chapel-Opossum Run Road, to the place of beginning, containing 65.670 acres, more or less, and subject to all valid easements and restrictions of record.
