I HEREBY CERTIFY THIS PLAT WAS PREPARED FROM AN ACTUAL FIELD SURVEY AND THAT MONUMENTS WERE PLACED AS INDICATED

Real estate situated in Darby Township of Madison County, Ohio; in the Virginia Military Survey number 3245; being part of the 148.74 acre tract of John Henry Yoder and Fannie Mae Yoder (Deed Record 292, page 949); and being further bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the west corner of a large concrete post found at the south corner of Virginia Military Survey number 5167 and the northeast line of said V.M.S. 3245. Said point also being the north corner of the 1.355 acre tract of the Union Free Will Baptist Church (Deed Record 161, page 497) and the True Point of Beginning.

Thence South 57 deg.-16'-12" West, 350.29 feet with the northwest line of said 1.355 acre tract (passing over an iron pipe set at 298.48 feet) to a railroad spike set in the centerline of State Route 161.

Thence with a curve to the right having a radius of 2864.79 feet, an arc length of 263.45 feet, and a chord which bears: (North 69 deg.-13'-14" West, 263.36 feet) to a railroad spike set at P.C. station 103+95.48 (SH 242-1939-O.D.O.T.).

Thence North 66 deg.-35'-10" West, 179.46 feet continuing with said centerline of State Route 161 to a railroad spike set.

Thence North 57 deg.-16'-12" East, 606.71 feet (passing over an iron pipe set at 48.17 feet) to an iron pipe set on the line dividing aforesaid V.M.S. 3245 and V.M.S. 5167.

Thence South 32 deg.-45'-30" East, 360.76 feet with said V.M.S. line to the *True Point of Beginning*.

Bearings are based on the Con-Rail Railroad assumed to be (North 39 deg.-45' West). The tract as described from an actual field survey performed on or about April 27, 1995, by Registered Surveyor Joseph P. Priday (S-7277), contains 4.000 acres, more or less, subject to all previous easements and rights-of-way of record. All iron pipes set are 3/4" x 30" galvanized pipe with plastic I.D. caps. The plat of survey is on file in the office of the Madison County Engineer.
